Theme: the story's central message; a life lesson

Some things to remember about theme are:

Theme is what the author wants you to remember most.

Occasionally the theme is stated directly in the novel/passage.

Most often, the theme is unstated and is revealed to the reader gradually throughout the

novel/passage.

Theme is written as a statement, not just a word.

• Different readers can have completely different theme statements. This is fine as long

as each reader can support his/her idea with evidence from the novel/passage.

Plan for understanding theme in Tuck Everlasting:

Step 1: List words from the novel that express the big ideas or topics from the novel.

Step 2: Think about what the characters in the novel do and say that relate to the topics

you listed above.

Step 3: Come up with a statement of the author's point or message based on one or more of

your big ideas.

Step 4: Find passages and/or quotes from the novel that support your theme statement.
